
My apologies for any misspelled and/or missed names.

Preads, cereals and pasta are all high in fiber which aids digestion and are an excellent source of carbohydrates which supply much needed energy for active cruisers. Canada's Food Guide recommends 5-12 servings per day of grain products.

Grain products must be purchased carefully since they tend to harbor insects and should be sealed tightly in canisters when stowed on board. I throw 4-5 bay leaves into the canisters as well which, for some reason, is an effective means of protecting grains from vermin. In ten years of crusing to Europe, South America, the Caribbean and Bahamas, we have never had weevils.

It is best to purchase flour, oats, bran and noodles in sealed packages rather than from bulk bins, if possible. I buy 2 or 5 pound bags of flour so I don't have large amounts open at one time. I double-wrap unopened bags in clean grocery bags in which I have placed 4-5 bay leaves and then seal them closed with masking tape and label them. I have stored all-purpose flour for a year this way but prefer to buy it more often than that. Other flours such as whole wheat and rye spoil more quickly, so for long-term storage it's best to refrigerate or freeze them.

Sheryl Shard's On Board Bread

- 2 cups very warm water (90° 100° F) or 2/3 cups seawater + 1/3 cup fresh
- 2 tablespoons (2 packets) active dry yeast 1/8 cup honey
- 2 teaspoons salt (if you don't use seawater)
- 5 cups all-purpose or bread flour
- I-2 cups additional flour

In a large bowl, mix the first 3 ingredients, stirring gently until yeast is dissolved. Let stand 5 minutes.

Add salt and 5 cups of flour and mix well. Add 1-2 cups more flour until no longer sticky. If the air is humid you may need to add even more flour.

Knead on a floured surface until smooth and elastic, about 10 minutes. Place in a lightly greased bowl and cover with a damp tea towel. Let rise in a warm draft-free place until double in size, about 40 to 60 minutes.

Punch down the dough and knead for 2 minutes. Divide into 2 loaves and let rise in lightly greased and floured bread pans for another 40 to 60 minutes.

Preheat oven to 350° F.

Bake until golden brown, about 25 to 30 minutes. Jab each loaf with a toothpick; if it comes out clean the bread is done. Remove loaves from pans. Let cool 15 minutes before cutting.

Boca Ciega Yacht Club youth program begins June 23

Boca Ciega Yacht Club announces the Youth Program for the summer of 2008. This year the summer instructional program, where we teach the basics of sailing, will begin on Monday June 23rd and run approximately to July 14th.

The classes will meet Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:00 AM until noon. There may be additional days added at the end of the scheduled classes for days that we can't sail for weather reasons.





We cover a lot of material in a short period of time and it's difficult to make up lost days. We ask, for that reason, that when you register you child, you dedicate them for those hours, to the class.

A parent or guardian must sign the application and fill out the emergency medical form.

By the end of the program students should be able to sail a pram and understand the principles and mechanics of sailing. The age of the students, however, will control the depth of this

understanding. The very basic concept of sailing is difficult for most children under 8. We, therefore,

require children to be at least 8 years old and they should be a mature

8. They must also pass a swim test, which consists of treading water for 5 minutes, donning a life jacket in the water, and swimming on their back while wearing a life jacket. They must also demonstrate an at ease demeanor in the water.





Students must wear sunscreen, hat or visor and water shoes. Flip-flops



Clam Bayon Restoration submitted by: Cindy

lam Bayou Restoration is now the center of a City Initiative; and we have been asked to help. Time is critical; Clam Bayou Restoration has momentum and needs your support now.

BACKGROUND:

On April 29, at a meeting with the Southwest Florida Management District (SWFWMD/SwiftMud) Clam Bayou Project Managers told Councilmember Bob Worthington and us that they will not act to save Clam Bayou unless specifically directed to do so by the Pinellas-Anclote River Basin Board. We need to help the City to motivate the Anclote River Basin Board to make SWFWMD do what they have been funded and authorized to do since 1995 to RESTORE, not REDEFINE, Clam Bayou.

The EPA and National Research Council (NRC), in 1992, defined restoration as return of an eco-system to as close as possible to its condition prior to disturbance. The Tampa Bay Estuary Program baseline objective for Clam Bayou restoration is the 1950s. As Mayor Yakes and Councilmember Worthington have said: No more debate or study is needed; the problems and solutions are obvious and it is time for action.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

ATTEND THE ANCLOTE RIVER BASIN BOARD MEETING

Wednesday, June 4, 9 AM, Clearwater City Hall; 112 South Osceola Avenue; Clearwater If the City Council approves the Resolution on Tuesday, the City will present it to the Anclote River Basin Board on June 4. A supportive public presence at the Clearwater meeting will have a lot of influence on the future of Clam Bayou and of Florida s water policies.

- E. That you want the Anclote River Basin Board to direct SWFWMD to fulfill your expectations for genuine restoration; redefinition is not acceptable.
- F. Thank them for their support of Clam Bayou restoration

Policy Change Regarding Live Aboard's submitted by Barb Meyer

he new lease between BCYC and the city of Gulfport provides for one designated live aboard in the club basin. This changes water front policy number 10 page 98; "Live aboards are not permitted in the marina. The definition of a live aboard is one who spends more than 3 days per month overnight on their boat in the marina."

At the May 5, 2008 BCYC Board meeting there was a motion approved establishing the criteria for live aboard applicants. The club live aboard criteria will be "D" under Club Boat Slip Standards starting on page 97 to read:

- Applicants must apply by letter to the Board of Directors. The letter should include:
 - a. the applicant's club history.
 - b. the length of time available to be the live aboard.
- 2. The applicant's vessel must be their permanent residence.
- 3. Be a member in good standing with no current debt to the club or City of Gulfport.
- 4. Be an active member as defined by boat slip standards, and comply with all waterfront policies. (Section C Club Boat Slip Standards)
- 5. Applicants will have been members of the club for at least 3 years.
- 6. The approved live aboard will be placed in a designated 35 foot slip no matter the size of their boat and pay the appropriate rent.
- The applicants will show proof they can meet all financial obligations to the club and City of Gulfport.
- 8. All applicants must appear before the board prior to selection by ballot.
- The term for live aboard will be for one year or at the discretion of the board and reviewed annually.
- Failure to remain a member in good standing or incurring debt with the City of Gulfport will result in immediate loss of live aboard privileges.

- II. Live aboard pets are subject to all clubhouse rules. (Section E, Item 7)
- 12. The approved live aboard will have no duties or obligations other than what is required for club membership.
- 13. The live aboard must have a separate mailing address from the club.
- 14. Live aboard vessels will be limited to two adults; age 21 and older.


Please remember that dues are payable in full on the First day of the Quarter, Late after the 10th, and if not paid by end of the month, membership will be terminated as required by the By-Laws.




News From The Desk of Your "Flag Officer"


He lost his sense of balance. With a resounding splash the club watched as Larry and his "Kicker" went swimming.


